

## ICD10 Coding

- PowerSoftMD has been able to handle ICD10 coding and claims since March 2014.
- The claims are submitted to the Clearing house in HCFA1500 format.
- We have offices that have successfully tested with our suggested clearing house and are sending claims in production.

- (2) For Paper claims purchase CMS HCFA Form 1500 (02-12) laser or ink-jet forms.

Due to Insurance 5010 requirements, you are probably already using this form.
- (3) Schedule a 15 minute appointment with Data Tec, so that we may connect to your system with you and activate your ICD10 features. We will turn on the ICD10 option for you, and run a Diagnosis Code list ICD9 to ICD10 conversion.
- (4) Select an initial insurance carrier to begin ICD10 testing with, typically Medicare.  
Set their Insurance Carrier Record from the Utility Menu, Insurance Carriers option to use ICD-10 coding.
- (5) Schedule testing with your Insurance claims clearing house, perform the testing with them.
- (6) Change over any other carriers to ICD-10 Coding, over time, as you wish.
